

## Student Planner for Global Studies Minor

### CHECKLIST

Students are required to take a minimum of 18 credit hours of course work (typically 6 courses). Three credits are to be fulfilled by taking GER 200 Foundations of Global Studies.

Fifteen hours are to be chosen from the list of designated elective courses. When selecting elective courses, note the following requirements: 1) Six elective credit hours **must** be at the 300 level or above. 2) A **maximum** of six elective credit hours may be taken at the 100 level. 3) Elective courses must come from **at least three** different departments or programs. Only one American history course may apply.

In addition to the 18 credit hours, students must demonstrate a second language capability equivalent to the 202 level (or take up to 12 hours foreign language). Students must also take part in a University-approved International Experience.

#### **Foundations of Global Studies**

In this course we will explore the diverse and often-conflicting meanings associated with the concept of globalization. We will examine world geography with respect to major regions and consider political, economic and cultural systems with an eye to what it means in the 21st century to be or become a "global citizen." The course will be interdisciplinary and will offer the opportunity for students to examine ways to "globalize" their horizons, their major disciplines, and their career paths.
