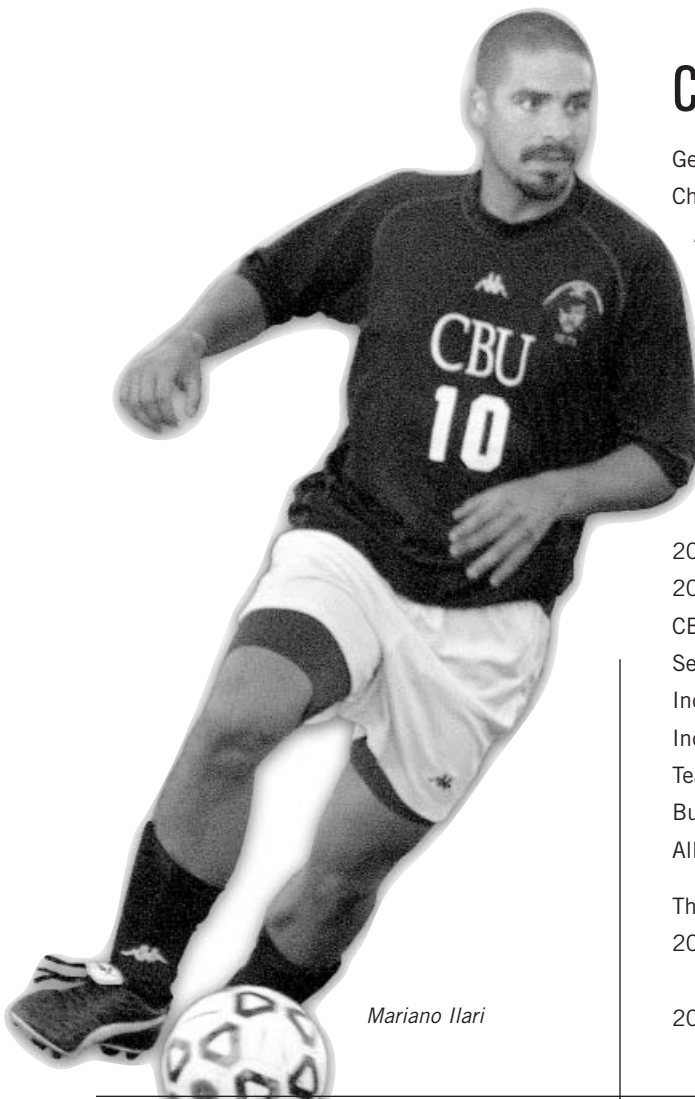

BROTHER STAN SOBCZYK, F.S.C UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Brother Stanislaus Sobczyk became the 20th President of Christian Brothers University in June 1999, returning to familiar territory since he had already served as Interim President of CBU in 1993-94. Brother Stan currently serves on the Board of Trustees for De La Salle School at Blessed Sacrament, the National Conference for Community and Justice (NCCJ), and St. Mary's University of Minnesota. He was knighted in 2000 by the Knights of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem. Previous positions include Assistant to the President and Coordinator of Catholic Education at St. Mary's College of California and Director of the Stritch Retreat Center on the CBU campus. Brother Stan has taught students from elementary school through doctoral level. He received a Bachelor of Science degree from Christian Brothers University in 1966, a Master of Arts degree from St. Louis University, a Master of Education degree from the University of Memphis, and a doctorate from the University of San Francisco. Brother Stan has been a Brother of the Christian Schools since 1963.

New coach finds depth, talent in Buccaneers

With 10 of 11 starters returning from a team that finished just one game out of contention for a Gulf South Conference regular season title in 2003, the Christian Brothers University Buccaneer soccer team looks to make a run at the post season once again.

First-year head coach **Clint Browne** returns to Memphis after coaching Lambuth University to a 14-4-2 record last season including a national No.16 ranking. Browne hopes to add some additional discipline to an already talented team.

The Bucs were 8-9 last season with a 4-3 mark in the GSC. They finished one game out of a regular-season championship, but because the GSC race was so tight, the Bucs didn't qualify for the conference tournament.

GOALKEEPERS: Senior **Marvin Hypolite** returns for his second season. Last year, Hypolite split time in goal with Beau Lotz, saw action in 10 matches and had a 4-2 record with a 1.31 goals against average, and posted 57 saves. He was named GSC Defensive Player of the Week for the week of October 21. Junior **Chad Rounder** will back up Hypolite this season. Rounder is a transfer from Bellarmine University and sat out last season as a redshirt. Freshmen **Ian Malnis** and **Daniel Foster** can also defend the net and should benefit from the expertise of two accomplished keepers.

BACKFIELD: Senior's **Egill Thorolfsson**, **Ross McLynn** and **Nick Chantara**, along with sophomore **Matt Bogan**, all return as starters in the Buccaneer backfield. McLynn sat out last year with a hamstring injury, but was a second-team All-GSC selection two seasons ago. Sophomore **Nathan Chantara** and senior **Robert Whitehead** are quality additions off the bench.

MIDFIELD: Sophomore **Kevin Walsh** and senior **Michael Vogel** return as starters for the Bucs. Vogel was a first-team All-GSC selection last season scoring five and assisting on one for 11 points. Walsh had five goals and three assists last year for 13 points. Junior **Ricky Biven** will see an occasional start. He scored one goal and added two assists a year ago for

two points. Junior transfers **Chris Marwood** and **Harry Murphy** should start on either side of the pitch and be a great addition to a potent offensive attack. Freshmen **David Miller** and **Ryan Peel** will compete for starting roles and, along with freshman **Brian McNamara**, will each be an asset to the team.

FORWARDS: Junior **Mariano Ilari** is the 2004 GSC Co-Player of the Year and is the fourth Buc in a row to hold that honor. Ilari scored 14 goals last season and added six assists for 34 points including three game-winning goals. He was named the GSC Offensive Player of the Week for the week of October 21, 2003. Senior **Alan Whittington** had three goals and a team-leading seven assists last season. He was a second-team All-GSC selection last year and was one of only four Bucs to play in every match last season. Senior **Derek Valen** returns after missing a season. He should provide some punch off what could be one of the deepest benches in the league. Freshman **Ryan Berger** brings additional back up support.

SCHEDULE: The Bucs play a tough schedule this season with five of the team's first six opponents finishing last season ranked in the top 25. The highlight weekend will include home matches against rival Barry University (preseason No.15) and the defending national champion and national No.1 Lynn University. They host conference strongholds Central Arkansas, Montevallo and West Florida, and the schedule could actually play into the Bucs' hands.

"We have a lot of tough matches at home and have a chance to win them all," said head coach Clint Browne. "If we take care of the matches we have on our own field, we could be in very good position going into the GSC Tournament."

Browne feels the team's greatest strength will be its overall depth.

"We have ten returning starters and four to five others that could make their way into the starting lineup at any time," he said. "The players have all played together for some time now and that is going to have to be one of our strengths."

HEAD COACH • FIRST SEASON

Clint Browne enters his first season as head coach of the Christian Brothers University Buccaneers soccer team.

Browne previously served as head men's soccer coach at Lambuth University in Jackson, TN. He guided the team, which was nationally ranked as high as 16th in the NAIA poll, to a 22-13-4 record over two seasons. Two players were named All-American and four named Academic All-American. Browne was named the Mid-South Conference Coach of the Year as well as the Region Coach of the Year.

Browne served as the assistant women's soccer coach at the University of Memphis from 1999 to 2000, helping to lead the team to its second-most successful season ever. He served as an assistant coach at CBU during the 1998 and 1999 seasons and was an assistant with the Memphis men's team during the 1995-1996 seasons.

A 1995 graduate of the University of Memphis, Browne led the Tigers to their only NCAA Tournament appearance in 1993, serving as a team captain that season. The team shared the Conference Championship with Saint Louis twice during his tenure. Browne played on two Tennessee Under-23 Olympic Development Teams that advanced to the national finals.

Browne played professionally for the New Orleans Riverboat Gamblers from 1995 to 1997, serving as team captain. He also played a season in the Irish Premier League for the Sligo Rovers in 1997-98.



Kieron Heblich

ASSISTANT COACH • SECOND SEASON

Kieron Heblich came to CBU after a standout career as a college soccer player at both the Junior College and NCAA levels. Heblich played two years at Meridian Community College in Mississippi, where he was an NJCAA All-American, a member of the National Tournament All-Tournament Team and an All-South Region Selection.

From Meridian he transferred to Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, where he was a member of the All-Region Team as well as

being All-Lone Star Conference, and a LSC All-Tournament Team member.

Heblich graduated from Northeastern in 2000 with a degree in health and human performance and spent one season as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's teams there.

He is currently completing a master's degree in education. Originally a native of Scarborough, England, Heblich spent two years in an apprenticeship with his hometown club.

The Gulf South Conference

The GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE (GSC) enters its 34th year of excellence, continuing a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences. With 17 universities in six southeastern states, the GSC is the largest playing Conference in Division II.



GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 13 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's golf. In 2003 and 2004, the GSC conducted a provisional championship in women's golf.

We take pride in our 38 National Team Championships in 12 sports and the emphasis on academic success by our coaches and student-athletes. The 2003-04 season was a banner campaign for the GSC, which claimed its first-ever National Championships in Women's Volleyball (North Alabama) and Men's Tennis (West Florida) and added its fifth Baseball crown behind Delta State's first-ever Title.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE, added Southeastern Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (increasing the membership to eight), and opened an office in Hammond, LA. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana (NWLA, now Northwestern State) were admitted. NELA withdrew to go Division I two years later, followed by SELA and Nicholls State in 1979.

The conference continued with seven

teams until 1981, when the presidents admitted Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983. Eight years of stability ended in 1991 when Tennessee-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial University (1992-93); University of Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State University, University of Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); University of West Florida (1994-95); and University of Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech University, University of Montevallo and Southern Arkansas University (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers University to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA conference at any level with 18 schools. The conference membership decreased to 17 when MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Former commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its present Birmingham location. The current commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Director Tim Andrzejewski, Office Manager Mary Jean Box and Assistant to the Commissioner Andrea Nguyen. The Chairman of the GSC Board of Directors is Dr. Robert McChesney of the University of Montevallo. Joining him on the executive committee are past-Chair Dr. Robert Brown (Arkansas Tech University) and Vice Chair Dr. Andy Westmoreland (Ouachita Baptist University). The Supervisors of

Officials are Bill Johnson (Football), Mike Murphy (Basketball-East Division) and John Caldwell (Basketball-West Division).
