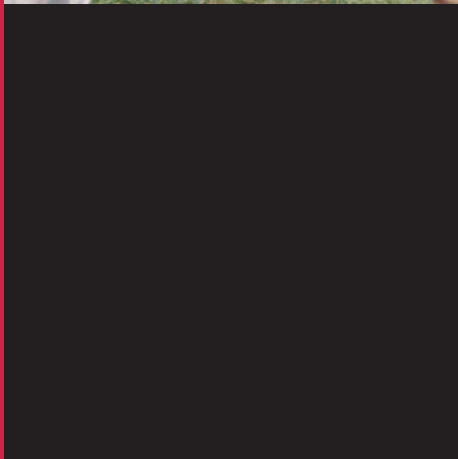

BROTHER STAN SOBCZYK, F.S.C UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Brother Stanislaus Sobczyk became the 20th President of Christian Brothers University in June 1999, returning to familiar territory since he had already served as Interim President of CBU in 1993-94. Brother Stan currently serves on the Board of Trustees for De La Salle School at Blessed Sacrament, the National Conference for Community and Justice (NCCJ), and St. Mary's University of Minnesota. He was knighted in 2000 by the Knights of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem. Previous positions include Assistant to the President and Coordinator of Catholic Education at St. Mary's College of California and Director of the Stritch Retreat Center on the CBU campus. Brother Stan has taught students from elementary school through doctoral level. He received a Bachelor of Science degree from Christian Brothers University in 1966, a Master of Arts degree from St. Louis University, a Master of Education degree from the University of Memphis, and a doctorate from the University of San Francisco. Brother Stan has been a Brother of the Christian Schools since 1963.

SEASON OUTLOOK

WITH SEVEN OF NINE starters returning and a freshman class that will see significant playing time, the CBU Lady Buccaneer softball team looks to be in good shape for 2005.

"The team has progressed well through the fall and into the spring season," said head coach Donna Crone. "The seniors (**Megan Sharp, Jennifer Longo and Melissa Eilers**) are all returning starters and will provide leadership for what is a relatively young team."

Last year's team saw records fall, but endured a disappointing end to the season. Longo set the CBU single-season home run record with four and graduating senior Megan Pilkington put her name among the top hitters of all time at CBU setting records for hits in a career (151) as well as having top five seasons in hits, average, home runs, doubles, and RBIs. Pilkington returns this year as the team's assistant coach.

PITCHERS

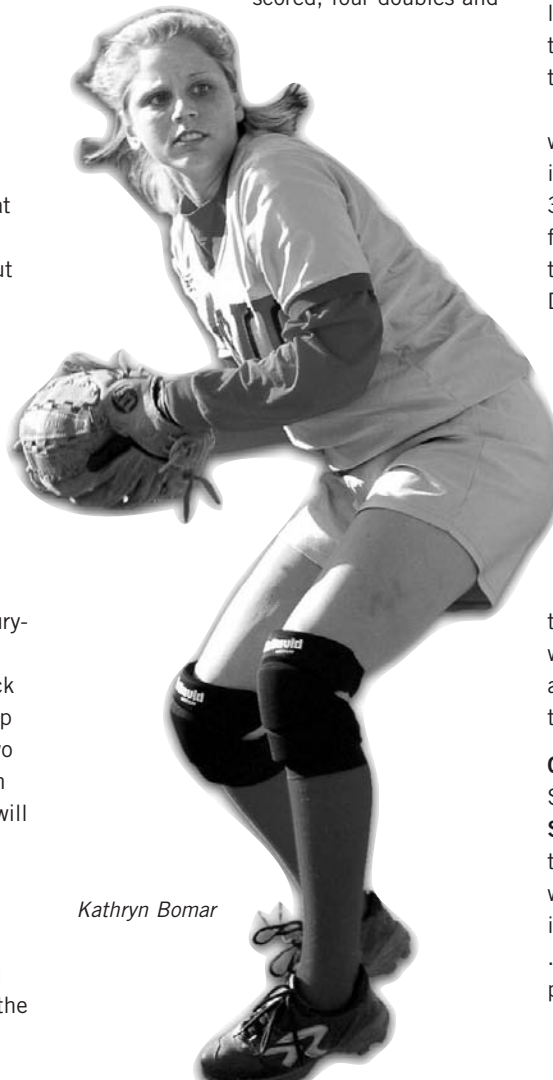
Sharp returns as the top pitcher for the third straight season. Following a less than stellar performance in 2003, she rebounded to win 13 games and strike out a team-high 90 batters in 2004. Sharp posted a 3.23 ERA and continued to bolster her own school records in many different pitching statistics. She had the best season a pitcher has ever had at CBU her freshman campaign when she won 15 games, had a 2.07 ERA and struck out 168 while walking just 42. The 15 wins and 168 strikeouts are both records at CBU.

Kathryn Bomar suffered through an injury-plagued season last year making 21 appearances. She had one save and struck out 19. Bomar should team-up with Sharp to be one of the conference's best one-two punches. **Angela Dunn** split time between the outfield and pitcher last season and will provide some much-needed depth to this year's staff. Dunn pitched in 16 games, starting eight and had a 4.96 ERA while striking out 13 batters. Freshman **Mandy Presson**, an Immaculate Conception High School product may see some time on the mound while developing her skills.

INFIELD

This year's Lady Buc infield may be the most experienced in the Gulf South Conference. Longo, **Jenny Bernard** and **Paula Cerrito** have all been playing their positions for the last two years, and the addition of freshman **Netia Shores** should help make for a most reliable infield. Longo returns for her third season at third base. Last year, Longo hit four home runs, a new CBU record, and drove in 15 runs, good for second on the team. She should be the team's clean up hitter.

Bernard has been the Lady Bucs starting shortstop and leadoff hitter every game she's played and didn't disappoint last season. After leading CBU in batting average her freshman campaign, Bernard rebounded last year to hit .292 with a team-high 21 runs scored, four doubles and

12 RBIs. She was named a second-team All-GSC selection. Cerrito returns for her third season at first base. One of the best fielders in the conference, Cerrito once again posted the team's best fielding percentage with a .982 mark last season. Serving as the number two hitter, she led the team in sacrifice bunts last year with 13. Shores is a freshman from Germantown High School. Last year with the Red Devils, she was named one of the Commercial Appeal's "Best of the Preps" and was also named an All-Metro selection. A solid hitter, Shores may give the Lady Bucs the power threat they have been looking for.

OUTFIELD

Eilers and **Hannah Shackelford** return as the starting left and center fielders. Shackelford was a freshman last season, but came on late raising her average nearly 50 points in the final month and securing her role as the team's number three hitter.

A solid fielder, Shackelford led the team with six outfield assists last year. Eilers improved every game last year starting in all 39 she played in. Second on the team with five outfield assists, she was fourth on the team with 12 RBIs and scored 10 times. Dunn will return to the outfield and platoon with freshmen Lauren Hearn and Presson. Dunn started in 16 of the 21 games she played in last season driving in six and scoring five times. Hearn is a talented freshman from Millington High School. She hit .396 with 44 hits, three home runs and 29 RBIs her senior season. She was a 2003 and 2004 Commercial Appeal Best of Preps selection and named to the All-Metro team both seasons. Presson was a first-team All-Region selection at IC and will provide speed and depth to this talented outfield.

CATCHER

Sophomore **Lauren Zavelli** and freshman **Samantha Maness** will platoon at catcher this year for the Lady Bucs. Zavelli split time with senior Sara Szpekowski last year starting in 16 of her 21 games played in. She hit .292 with 14 hits and six RBIs. An excellent pitch caller, Zavelli will be an excellent

Head Coach • Sixth Season

DONNA CRONE enters her sixth season as head coach at Christian Brothers University. She graduated from CBU with a B.S. in business in 1983. Crone played two seasons of basketball and two seasons of tennis earning a Most Valuable Player Award in tennis her senior year.

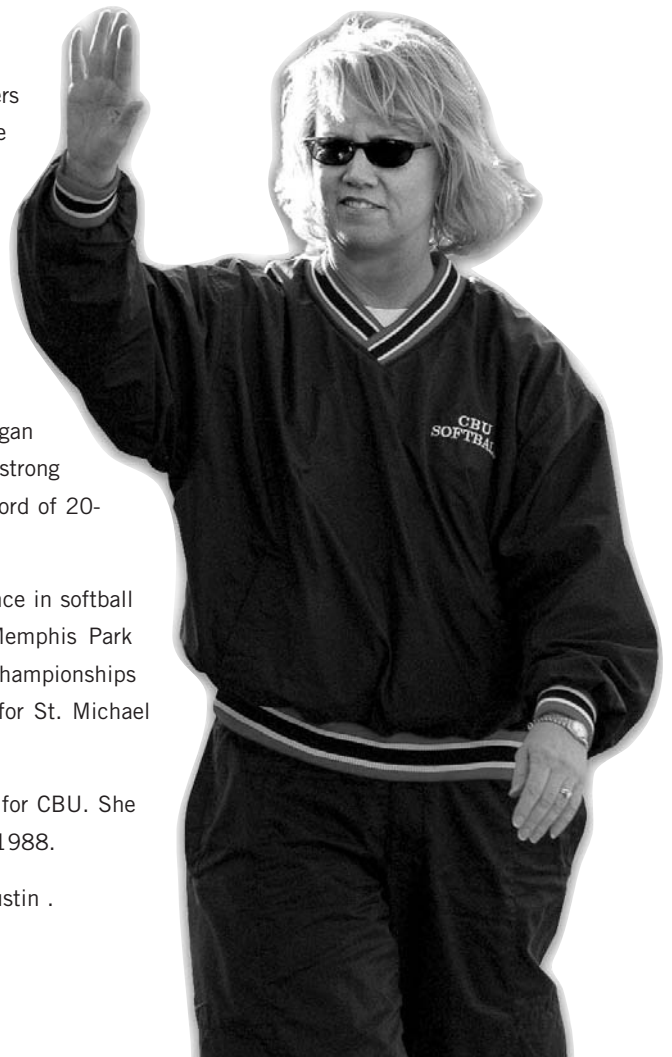
The CBU softball program enters its 11th year, but under Crones' leadership, the Lady Bucs have reached several milestones and added to some record books. On March 15, 2000, CBU set and still owns the NCAA Div. II record for triples in one game (7).

The 2001 season brought the program its first post-season honors with Megan Pilkington (Elgin, IL) being named the GSC Freshman of the Year. Led by the strong pitching of Megan Sharp (SBA, Memphis), the Lady Bucs posted their best record of 20-21.

In 2005, Crone will surpass more than 250 games as head coach. Her experience in softball includes 17 years of coaching women's softball (Sherry's Hallmark) in the Memphis Park Commission, winning 12 league championships, two runner-up titles in the city championships and two Memphis City Championships. Crone also served as athletic director for St. Michael Church and School for four years.

Crone is also Senior Women's Administrator and the NCAA Compliance Officer for CBU. She holds a Master's in Business Administration from the University of Memphis in 1988.

She lives in Cordova with husband Chris (CBU, '76) and children Kristen and Justin .

DESIGNATED PLAYER

When not pitching, Bomar will be the Lady Bucs' designated player this season. Last year, she had four hits including a double and two RBIs. A talent at the plate and on the mound, Bomar hopes to be a rally starter for the Lady Bucs this year.

With a schedule that includes 16 games at home, the Lady Bucs are poised to make their first trip to the GSC Tournament.

Graduate Assistant Coach • First Season



Pilkington earned a bachelor's degree in Information Technology Management in 2005 and is completing an MBA at CBU.

Megan Pilkington returns to CBU as a graduate assistant coach. A four-year starter for CBU, Pilkington was the Gulf South Conference Freshman of the Year in 2000 and was a first-team selection this past season.

She holds the CBU career record for hits (151) and had owned the record for home runs before current Lady Buc Jennifer Longo broke the record this season.

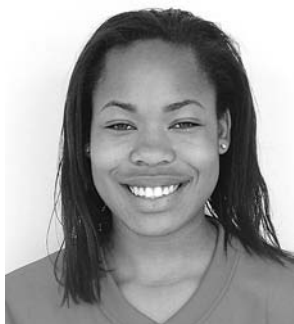

The Gulf South Conference

The GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

(GSC) enters its 34th year of excellence, continuing a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences.

With 17 universities in six southeastern states, the GSC is the largest playing Conference in Division II.

GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 13 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's golf. In 2003 and 2004, the GSC conducted a provisional championship in women's golf.

We take pride in our 38 National Team Championships in 12 sports and the emphasis on academic success by our coaches and student-athletes. The 2003-04 season was a banner campaign for the GSC, which claimed its first-ever National Championships in Women's Volleyball (North Alabama) and Men's Tennis (West Florida) and added its fifth Baseball crown behind Delta State's first-ever Title.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE, added Southeastern Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (increasing the membership to eight), and opened an office in Hammond, LA. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana (NwLA, now Northwestern State) were admitted. NELA withdrew to go Division I two years later, followed by SELA and Nicholls State



in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the presidents admitted Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983. Eight years of stability ended in 1991 when

Tennessee-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial University (1992-93); University of Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State University, University of Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); University of West Florida (1994-95); and University of Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech University, University of Montevallo and Southern Arkansas University (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers University to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA conference at any level with 18 schools. The conference membership decreased to 17 when MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season.

Former commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its present Birmingham location. The current commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Director Tim Andrzejewski, Office Manager Mary Jean Box and Assistant to the Commissioner Andrea Nguyen. The Chairman of the GSC Board of Directors is Dr. Robert McChesney of the University of Montevallo. Joining him on the executive committee are past-Chair Dr. Robert Brown (Arkansas Tech University) and Vice Chair Dr. Andy Westmoreland (Ouachita

Baptist University). The Supervisors of Officials are Bill Johnson (Football), Mike Murphy (Basketball-East Division) and John Caldwell (Basketball-West Division).
