gulfsouthconference

The GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE (GSC) enters its 36th year of excellence, extending a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite NCAA Division II conferences. The GSC is the largest playing Conference in Division II, with 17 schools.

GSC members feature comprehensive athletic programs that compete for 14 official conference championships: football, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's golf.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed by six universities in the summer of 1970: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), UT-Martin and Troy State. In 1971, the league changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE.

The conference admitted Valdosta State in 1981. West Georgia joined in 1983. UT-Martin and Troy State went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, before the beginning of an expansion resulting in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96). Jacksonville State went Division I at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers University. In 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University. MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2003 season.

The current commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October 1992. He is assisted by Sports Information Director Michael Anderson, Assistant Sports Information Director Tim Andrzejewski, and part-time Assistant Andrea Nguyen. The Chairman of the GSC Board of Directors is Dr. Robert

McChesney (Montevallo). Joining him on the executive committee

are past-Chair Dr. Robert Brown (Arkansas Tech) and Vice Chair Dr. Andy Westmoreland (Ouachita Baptist).

Kieron Heblich was named head coach of the Lady Buccaneer soccer program on May 6, 2005 after serving two years as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's programs at CBU.

Heblich came to CBU after a standout career as a collegiate soccer player at both the Junior College and NCAA levels. Heblich played two years at Meridian Community College in Mississippi where he was an NJCAA All-American, a member of the National Tournament All-Tournament Team and an All-South Region Selection.

From Meridian he transferred to Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, where he was a member of the All-Region Team both seasons as well as being All-Lone Star Conference, and a LSC All-Tournament Team member.

Heblich graduated from Northeastern in 2000 with a degree in health and human performance and spent one season as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's teams. He earned his master's degree in education from CBU in May of 2005.

Originally a native of Scarborough, England, Heblich spent two years in an apprenticeship with his hometown club.
