Not Saying Goodbye

Margaret Cardwell, Plough Library's director, is leaving us, but we are not going to say goodbye. On her last day we are going to wish her well, but we will not say goodbye. The reason we will not say goodbye is that we expect her to remain a part of the CBU Community.

During her tenure as director, Margaret made a great difference in the services and the operation of Plough Library. When she came, Plough Library had been without a director for almost one year. We did not have an up-to-date computerized library management system. We were without a Curriculum Library located in our building. We did not have a designated place where students and faculty could relax and have a fresh cup of coffee or hot chocolate. We were without a state-of-the-art federated search engine and had a lot fewer databases for it to search. We also did not have a formal structure that encouraged interaction between librarians and faculty. And finally, librarians were not part of the Faculty Assembly.



Margaret changed all these things and more during her tenure here. She was determined to move Plough Library forward by leaps and bounds, and she did it. Most significant among her achievements was the acquisition and implementation of the Voyager integrated library management system in 2004, which required a grant to obtain, as did the federated search engine.

These are just a few of the reasons why we refuse to say goodbye. We hope and expect that Margaret will remain a part of the CBU Community for years to come in some capacity.

UPDATE: Information Literacy in the Curriculum Development Grant

In January, 2007 Plough Library was awarded a grant to implement a pilot program to integrate American Library Association Information Literacy principles into sixteen courses at CBU. The program is expected to lead to the integration of Information Literacy principles throughout the curriculums at CBU.

The program ran from February 2007 to June 15, 2007, which is a relatively short period of time for such a project. It involved the participation and collaboration of five librarians, library staff, and eight professors. The librarians used their roles as liaisons to the various schools and departments as a springboard to get the program started.

We were successful in integrating Information Literacy principles and components into sixteen courses. Two faculty members from each school collaborated with liaisons on two of their individual courses to achieve the integration of Information Literacy components.

The collaboration experience and the processes used in the pilot program are expected to be the catalyst that will lead to the integration of Information Literacy principles throughout the curriculums.

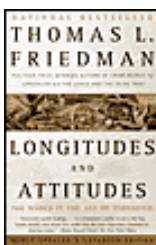

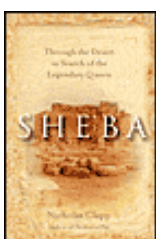

[Wiley InterScience](http://www.interscience.wiley.com) is an online journal service from John Wiley and Sons. CBU users now have access to 219 full-text electronic journal titles through a partnership with TENN-SHARE.

You can search all of the content at once or browse journals by topic. Topic areas include Business, Chemistry, Computer Science, Earth and Environmental Science, Education, Engineering, Law, Life Sciences, Mathematics and Statistics, Medicine and Healthcare, Physics and Astronomy, Polymers and Materials Science, Psychology, and Social Sciences.

NOTE: Wiley InterScience offers an individual registration option on the top right of the screen for users so they can save articles for later use. This login is not required in order to use the database.

A great resource for public policy issues, CQ Researcher offers thorough, balanced reports, covering the background and development of a controversy or public policy problem, the current situation and a future outlook on the issue. These reports include pro/con essays, as well as a chronology of relevant events and legislation. Recent report topics include Future of Feminism, Nuclear Energy, and Presidential Power.

With reports going back to 1923, [CQ Researcher Plus Archive](http://www.cqresearcher.com) is also a useful source for historical topics like prohibition, the Great Depression era, WWII, civil rights and desegregation, foreign relations and the Cold War, etc.

We also now have access to a new product from CQ Press, *CQ Global Researcher*, CQ Global Researcher is included in CQ Researcher and consists of thematic monthly reports offering a variety of international perspectives on global issues.



Xreferplus Changes Name: Now Credo Reference



One of our quick reference databases has a new name. Xreferplus is now called [Credo Reference](http://www.credo.com). All of the content is the same as be-

fore, including over 250 reference books. Credo Reference includes encyclopedias, dictionaries, thesauri, and books of quotations; as well as subject-specific titles covering everything from art to accountancy and literature to law. 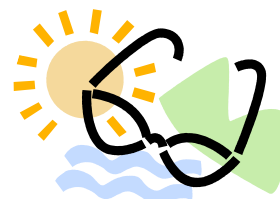
