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
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
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## New Fall Day Undergraduate Students 1981-2020




## Day Undergraduate First-Time Freshman by School

### Fall 2011-2020




## Fall Enrollment by Program 1954-2020

### Fall 1986-2020











## Credit Hours by School Adult Undergraduate Programs Fall 2013 - Fall 2020




