## Instructions:

Your FAFSA was selected by the U.S. Department of Education to verify high school completion status. Please provide <u>one</u> of the following documents that indicate your high school completion status when you begin college in 2022-2023. The processing of your Federal Student Aid cannot be completed until one of these documents is received and reviewed by the Student Financial Aid Office.

## A. Acceptable Documentation

- > A copy of your high school diploma.
- ➤ If you completed secondary education in a foreign country, a copy of your "secondary school leaving certificate" or other similar document.
- > A copy of your final official high school transcript indicating the date when your diploma was awarded.
- ➤ A state certificate or transcript received after you passed a State authorized examination that the State recognizes as the equivalent of a high school diploma (GED test, HiSET, TASC, or other State-authorized examination).
- An academic transcript that indicates you successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree.
- ➤ If you were homeschooled in a state where state law requires you to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a copy of that credential.
- ➢ If you were homeschooled in a state where state law does not require you to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript or the equivalent, signed by your parent or guardian that lists the secondary school courses you completed and includes a statement that you successfully completed a secondary school education in a homeschool setting.
